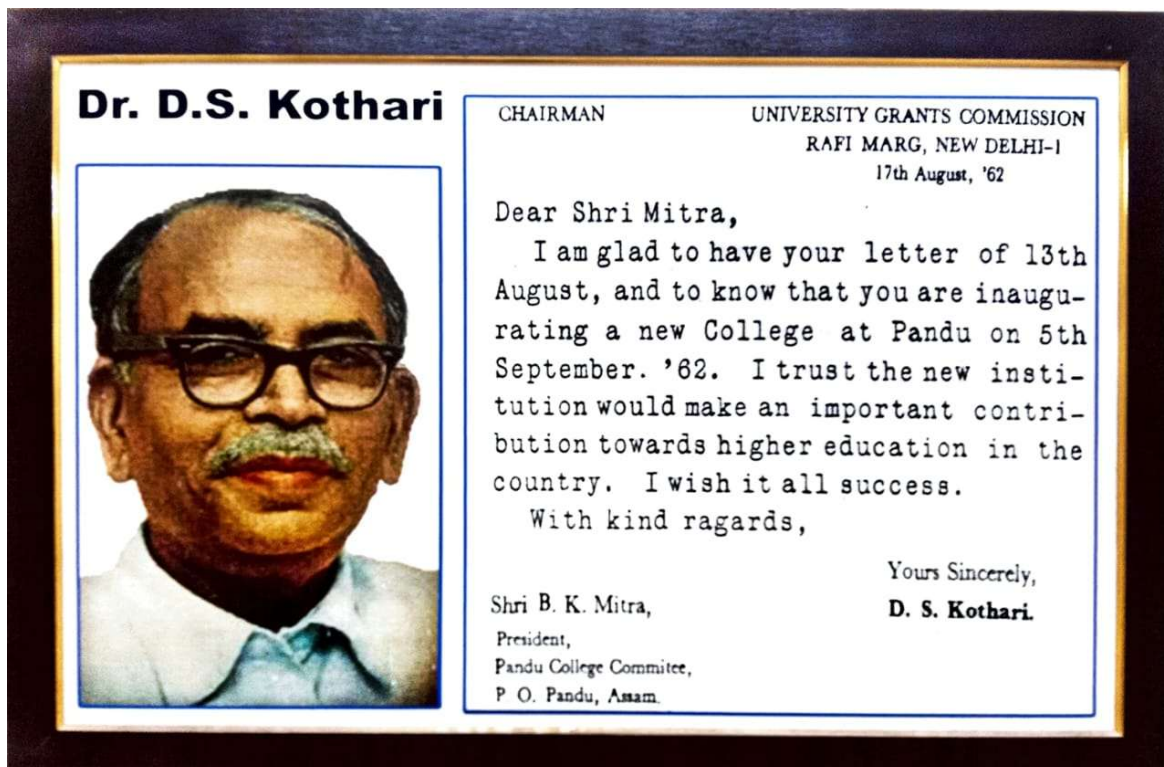
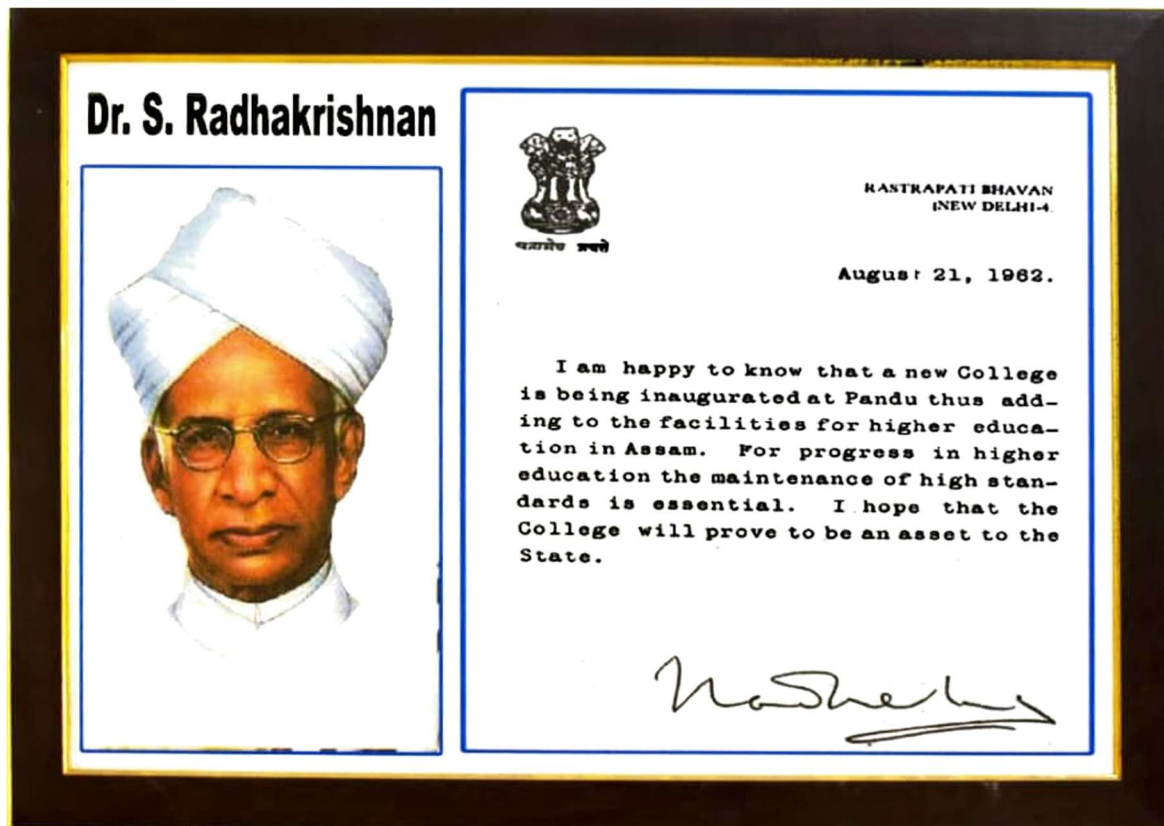

THE COLLEGE

Pandu College, adjacent to the banks of the Brahmaputra River, is a premier Centre of learning in the northeast of India. Since the day of its establishment on 5th September, 1962, the college has been meeting the needs of thousands of students in the higher education arena. The college was established with the untiring efforts of great souls like Sri Deben Sarma, Sri S.K. Roy, Sri B.K. Mitra and Sri Satya Kinkar Sen to name a few and also the generosity and good wishes of the NF Railway Authorities. Fortunately at the initial stage, the N.F. Railway accorded permission to start classes in the vacated Netaji Vidyapeeth premises and also approved 99-year lease of 3.95 acres of railway land to set up the college.

Sri Satya Kinkar Sen sacrificed his job of Lecturer and HoD of English in the Handique Girls' College to launch the new venture as its founder Principal. The first admission notice to the Pre-University and Degree classes (night-shift) in the Arts and Commerce in the college was served on 30.11.1963. Within two years i.e. by 1965, the Science and Arts streams had become functional for both day and night shifts. Such was the dedication of the teachers that within a short span of time, Pandu College retained the distinction of being one of the most preferred institutions of higher education and learning. The honours courses were introduced phase-wise from 1967-68 and the college, in the meantime, was affiliated to Gauhati University.

A host of dedicated teachers and efficient administrators have worked and are working continuously to enable Pandu College to attain its present position. By producing skilled human resources, the college has contributed immensely to all spheres of the state and the country.

Pandu College takes pride in the fact that its alumni are also contributing to the society by working in various positions of State and Central Government as well as in various colleges, universities and reputed research institutions in India and abroad.

Presently the college comprises 23 full-fledged departments spread over Arts, Commerce and Science disciplines. The college has well-equipped library with wireless internet connectivity and UGC INFLIBNET-NLIST e-journal browsing facility. In addition, each department has its own library from which books are regularly issued to the students. The other special features of the college are- separate Boys' and Girls' hostels, a gymnasium with various facilities and a canteen. Moreover, well-equipped laboratories are available for practical classes in the practical oriented courses. Apart from multiple degree courses, the college offers vocational courses in Computer Application and career oriented courses in Human Rights Education. The college has a Biotech-Hub granted by the DBT, Government of India, which started functioning in the year 2011.

The college offers regular P.G. courses under Gauhati University in the departments of Assamese, Education, Economics, Zoology, Geography, Political Science and History. The College also plans to introduce PG course in Botany, Mathematics and Chemistry and in other core subjects in the days to come.

Bearing in mind, the necessity of a healthy environment, the college was declared a tobacco-free zone. Yoga camps are organized by the NSS wing in the college and the NCC wing is at present fully active. Pandu College has been constantly executing governmental and in-house plans to enhance the scope of its educational initiatives. The college has grown in course of time tremendously in the last 5 decades and nurtures a dream of becoming a Centre of Excellence.

THE CAMPUS

Situated at the periphery of Nilachal Hills the Pandu College campus is extremely safe and congenial for students. It is located in an area surrounded by local communities who are closely related with the institution. It is surrounded by boundary walls and high raised gates with security guards at all entrances and exits. While entering the college premises it is mandatory for the students to wear college uniform and to carry valid identity cards issued by the college. Visitors are required to register their names and purpose of visit at the college gates to avoid entry of any unscrupulous individual to the campus. The College Administration has installed closed circuit cameras to keep a constant vigilance on the campus and to ensure security of the students. The infrastructural set up of the college is spread across different Buildings/Blocks as given below:

Administrative Building

The Administrative Building includes the Principal's Chamber, Office, Digital Classroom, Conference Hall, Girls' Common Room and some of the Academic Departments.



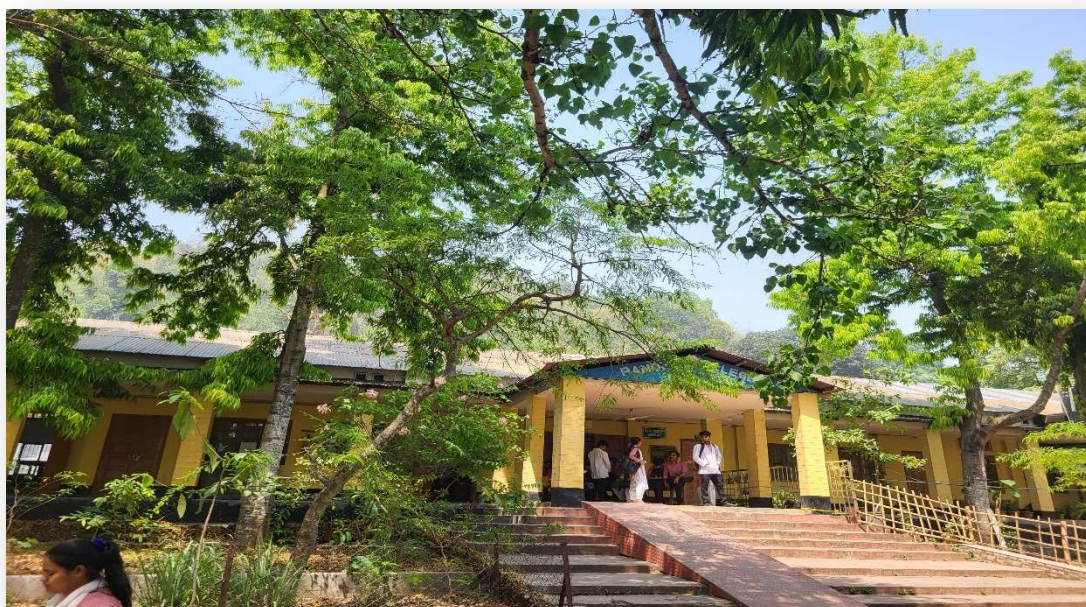
Library Block

This building contains Boys' Common Room, Students' Union Office, Gymnasium Hall, Health Care Center and IGNOU study centre.

TEACHING-LEARNING PROCESS

Education is the process of facilitating learning and the acquisition of knowledge. As such, Pandu College strives to ensure that the teaching-learning process involves assessing the learning needs, learning objectives, teaching-learning strategies, implementation of various methods and evaluation of the learning outcomes.

The college believes that, teaching-learning is possible and attainable by providing conducive learning environment to the students. The teachers serve as the prime movers of the educational wheel, while the students are the key participants in the learning process. Keeping this in view, attention is given to the planning and organization of the subject matter, content and activities.

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The quality of instructions is another consideration and various methods such as lectures, demonstrations, power points, group discussions, brain storming sessions, practical, field visits are employed to make the learning process more enriching and interesting. Classroom management, and appropriate control and discipline is emphasized. Care is taken to understand the Psychology of the learners and to channel instructions keeping their interests in mind. To ensure that learners remain motivated and active, Evaluation of the learning outcomes are monitored by conducting internal tests, assignments and project works. It is envisaged that the teaching-learning process followed by the college would facilitate better understanding and grasp of the different subjects that are being offered to the vast array of students who have different goals and aspirations in their academic life.





ACADEMIC AND RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

All the faculty members of Pandu College are actively involved in research work. More than 300 research papers have been published by its faculty members in various National and International Journals of repute. Presently, 8 faculty members of this institution have Ph.D. guide-ship under different Universities and 9 students are presently pursuing PhD work under the guide-ship of these faculty members of the college. Many faculty members are serving as Principal Investigators in various research projects funded by different funding agencies.

The college also provides research grant to the faculty members of the college for pursuing research work. The grant is Rs. 50000.00 per research project under all streams. This scheme has been initiated in the year 2022 and altogether 5 faculty members have received this grant. In addition, the college has initiated Minor Research Projects, sponsored/funded by Pandu College Research Council, only for students from 2024-25 onwards with a grant of Rs. 20000.00 per research project.



Seminars and Workshops

Seminars and workshops of regional and National level are organized regularly at Pandu College for academic enhancement of both students and faculty members. There is well equipped Seminar Halls for organizing such activities. All the Departments organize lectures, seminars and popular talks regularly.

Institutional Biotech Hub

The Biotech-Hub of the college, granted by the DBT, Government of India has been actively involved in teaching and conducting hands-on training programmes for the students of the college in various branches of Life Sciences since its inception.



Common Instrumentation Facility

The College has been enriched in the field of research by the addition of a Common Instrumentation Facility (CIF), funded by OIL, Noonmati Refinery in association with Assam Science Technology and Environment Council (ASTEC). The CIF is open to all research scholars, students and faculty members who wish to avail of its facilities like FT-IR, UV-vis spectroscopy, Gas Chromatography, Gel Electrophoresis, Optical Microscope, High Speed Centrifuge etc.



Remote Sensing and GIS Laboratory

The College is equipped with a Remote Sensing and GIS Laboratory which carries out studies and research on various aspects of hydrology and water resources using Remote Sensing and GIS techniques.

Language Laboratory

The College has a language laboratory which aims to engage students in overcoming the influence of native dialect, stumbling of words in between a conversation, enhancing pronunciation, correcting grammatical mistakes, ameliorate vocabulary, thus developing communication skills, to meet the global standards in English proficiency. Owing to its multiple features and usability, we strive and believe that the language laboratory can bring positive results in students who have limited exposure to English in their day-to-day life.

LIBRARY

Pandu College Library is one of the best college libraries in Assam in providing efficient service to the readers. It is a place of attraction for the students. The library has been aiming to supplement the knowledge of the students, which they acquire from their teachers. It is well stocked with more than 46,306 texts and reference books, more than a dozen of local and national newspapers, journals and other information sources like maps, globes, floppy discs, CD-ROMs etc. The library has a reading room for students and a space is kept exclusively for teachers.

Library card is issued to every student soon after the admission and the students can borrow books and journals which help them in broadening their knowledge and experience. The library is fully computerized and is upgraded with **KOHA** software with bar coding system. The College is also registered under N-LIST programme under UGC-Inflibnet Digital Library Consortium. In addition to the central library, every department has a departmental library from which students and teachers can borrow books

Pandu College Library follows open Access System reducing the barriers between the books and readers. Students are allowed to go to the stacks of books and have direct access to the best thoughts of the world preserved for centuries in books.

HOSTELS

The College has three full-fledged hostels in the vicinity of the campus for the convenience of students coming from remote areas. The Boys' hostel named as **Ambikagiri Roy Choudhury Boys' Hostel** can accommodate **60** students. There are 15 well furnished rooms having seat capacity of 4 boarders in each.

The two Girls' hostels namely **Chandraprabha Saikiani Women's Hostel** and **Mamoni Raisom Goswami Girls' Hostel** have a total of **104** seats. Boarders of the hostels can avail facilities such as medical care, yoga and meditation classes, library and wall-magazine, indoor games and community television. Keeping in mind the holistic growth of students, outdoor activities like city tour, educational tour and picnic are also arranged periodically. Attendance of boarders during daily roll calls followed by assembly prayer is compulsory. Boarders are under the purview of Hostel Supervision Committee, where the Hostel Superintendents are the coordinators.

The hostels maintain a policy of zero tolerance towards ragging and any form of harassment. Students from various parts of North East India take admission into the hostels thereby creating a space of cultural confluence. The Boys' and Girls' hostels of the college publish their wall magazines regularly. The Boys' Hostel publishes an annual magazine, **Nabarun** and the Girls' hostel publishes a wall magazine, **Sereki**.

FUNCTIONING OF THE HOSTEL

For the smooth functioning of the hostel there is a Hostel Supervision Committee, which looks after the different affairs of the hostel besides framing rules and regulations for both Boys' and Girls' Hostel. The Principal of the college is the Chairperson and the superintendents of both Boys' and the Girls' Hostel as the convener. The other members include the former superintendents and senior faculty members of the college. The superintendent looks after the day-to-day affairs of the hostel with assistance from the monitors and other student office bearers of the hostels.

- A gymnasium hall in the campus is easily accessible to the boarders
- The Girls' Hostel is under the surveillance of CCTV network

ELIGIBILITY FOR HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

- Only regular students of the College are eligible for hostel accommodation.
- Admission to the hostels is purely on the merit basis.
- Outstation students will be given preference for admission into hostels.
- The admission to the hostels will be finalized by the respective Superintendents on the basis of personal interview and the documents produced

HOSTEL ADMISSION PROCEDURE

All HS/TDC/PG first year students desiring hostel accommodation should apply to the respective Hostel Superintendents in prescribed form (forms available in college website). Following documents must be attached with the completed application form at the time of submission:

- College admission receipt.
- Permanent Resident Certificate (PRC).
- Two passport-size photographs.
- Copy of mark sheet

The College Authority reserves the right to refuse or cancel admission to a candidate without assigning any reason. The decision of the College Authority is final and binding.

In addition to the above mentioned clubs, the college has some others cells also which are actively involved in various student related activities.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

Pandu College has an active Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as per the guidelines of The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The IQAC plans, guides and monitors Quality Assurance (QA) and Quality Enhancement (QE) activities of the college. The main task of the IQAC is to channelize the efforts and measures of the college towards maintaining academic excellence and robust internal governance. IQAC initiate plan and supervise various activities which are necessary to increase the quality of education. IQAC promotes several activities such as seminars, workshops, symposia, conferences, panel discussions and academic meetings.

Right to Information Cell

In compliance with the RTI Act 2005, the College has constituted the RTI Cell of which the Principal is the First Appellate Authority. The aim of RTI is to promote transparency and accountability in official matters.

Students' Grievances Redressal Cell

As suggested by University Grants Commission, New Delhi, the College has established a Students' Grievance Redressal Cell, to provide a mechanism for redressal of students' grievances and ensure the transparency in admission, and prevention of unfair practices, etc. The function of the cell is to look into the complaints lodged by any student, and judge its merit. The cell is also empowered to look into matters of harassment. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the cell. In case the person is unwilling to appear in self, grievances may be sent through e-mail to the Principal or to the co-ordinator of the cell.

Anti-Ragging Committee

As per judgements and directions of the Supreme Court of India, UGC guidelines and State Government's Instructions, Pandu College is following 'Zero-Tolerance Policy' towards ragging. To prevent any kind of such incident, the College has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee which is continuously monitoring the students. Any student of Pandu College accused and found guilty of ragging, will be severely dealt with, in accordance with the Provisions of the Law. Any student who faces any kind of ragging incident are hereby asked to report to the Principal immediately.

NSS (National Service Scheme)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Pandu College is rendering commendable work by encouraging students to cherish dignity of labour and reverence for the composite Indian Culture through its regular Personality Development Programmes and other special camping activities. Pandu College NCC army Wing is enriched with boys and girls. It is one of the best wings in the state, which also facilitates jobs for the Cadets. If any student enrolls as a NCC cadet, he/she must attend 75% parades; otherwise he/she will be disqualified from NCC.

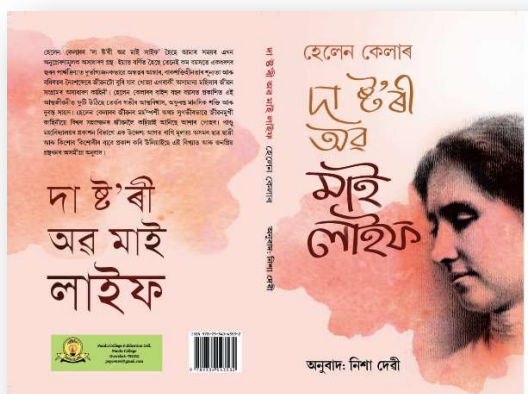


Pre-Examination & Career Counselling Cell

The college has set up a Pre-Examination ^ Career Counselling Cell to provide information and to organize programmes highlighting career opportunities in different fields. It also organizes Campus Recruitment Drives in which students get job opportunities during their stay in the college.

SALIENT FEATURES OF FYUGP

- In the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours). If you exit in the middle, the doors are still open for you to enter into the programme again and you can start the journey from where you left.
- In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.
- If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree.
- Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.

- Admission into FYUGP (Science/Arts/Commerce) 1st semester will be conducted via the common Admission Portal available in SAMARTH platform <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in> as per Government Notification.
- Complete application form in all respects, must be submitted online on or before the last date of submission.
- **NECESSARY DOCUMENTS MUST BE UPLOADED ONLINE WHILE SUBMITTING THE FORM. THE COLLEGE WILL NOT ENTERTAIN ANY INCOMPLETE APPLICATION OR APPLICATION SUBMITTED AFTER THE LAST DATE OF SUBMISSION.**
- Applications without relevant documents will be rejected.

Admission Guidelines

1. Application Form for admission to various courses is to be submitted through online mode in the prescribed form within a specific date as notified in advance.
2. The merit lists will be displayed on College Notice Board/Website, well ahead of the admission date.
3. **Admission will be held in offline mode in the college as per the dates of admission to be notified in due course of time.**
4. Admission will be held purely on merit basis:
 - a) Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of **Major** and on the basis of the marks obtained in Best Three Subjects of the qualifying examination.
 - b) In case a student does not want to opt for any Major *i.e.*, **No Major**, s/he will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations. Merit list will be prepared on the basis of Best of Three Subjects.
 - c) No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless s/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by Gauhati University.

- d) No Hard copy of admission forms will be available in the College.
 - e) All prospective students who wish to take admission into the GU-FYUGP, must be registered with the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) and MUST obtain the 12-digit ABC ID through the Digilocker Platform (<https://digilocker.meripchchaan.gov.in>) prior to their admission. The ABC ID will be required either at the time of Registration or at the time of Downloading of the Admit Card for the First Semester examination.
 - f) The candidate must generate Unique ID through the web portal of Director of Higher Education, Assam.
5. A student has to upload the self-attested copies of the following documents at the time of online form submission. The same documents **in original** have to be produced at the time physical verification.
- HSLC admit card / certificate for proof of age.
 - HSLC mark sheet.
 - Original mark sheet of last examination passed.
 - Original certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
 - Gap certificate (in case, the student has passed the qualifying exam earlier).
- NB: The gap certificate must be issued by the Head of the Educational Institution last studied/Gazetted officer/registered medical practitioner)*
- Caste certificate (in case of SC/ ST/ OBC/ MOBC/EWS).
 - Migration / Transfer certificate as the case may be.
 - Certificate of proficiency in co-curricular as the case may be.
 - Parents' Income Certificate (For Free Admission).
 - Certificate of domicile of Assam (As per any document specified by the Govt.).
 - Bank details of the student are a must to get Govt. benefits, if applicable.
6. Mark calculation process for admission into FYUGP 1st Semester courses is as follows:
- For Admission into B.Sc., BCA, and Biotechnology 1st Semester, **TOTAL MARKS OF THE BEST THREE SCIENCE SUBJECTS OF THE HS FINAL EXAM WILL BE CONSIDERED (Excluding English, MIL).**
 - For Admission into B.A. 1st Semester, **TOTAL MARKS OF THE BEST THREE SUBJECTS OF HS FINAL EXAM WILL BE CONSIDERED.**
 - For Admission into B. Com. 1st Semester, **TOTAL MARKS OF BEST THREE COMMERCE SUBJECTS OF H S FINAL EXAM WILL BE CONSIDERED.**
7. The subject Physical Education will not be considered as qualifying subject for admission into Degree course (1st Semester courses).
8. If any student, after admission, remains absent continuously for 15 days in the classes from the commencement of the regular classes, without any intimation to the college authority or to the concerned departments his/her admission will be cancelled without notice and his/her seat will be filled up from the merit list.
9. Maximum two years gap period will be considered in case of students who aspire to take admission into this institution and possess gap certificates for that period. However, the admission of such (gap) students will not exceed 10% of the total seats.

10. The Degree students should indicate any one of the three core subjects, selected by them, for pursuing Major/Honours.
11. All admissions are provisional subject to the approval of Gauhati University.
12. Admission to the college hostel will be held immediately after the college admission, for which separate application in prescribed format is to be submitted. Admission will be strictly on merit basis.

The FYUGP Admission Process of Pandu College will be as per the Rules & Regulations of Gauhati University. Students are asked to frequently visit the Gauhati University website for latest updates.

TWO-YEAR POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME

The admission to the Post Graduate Programme in various departments will be held on the basis of Common Entrance Tests conducted by Gauhati University.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS SEEKING FREE ADMISSION

- The selection under free admission category will be strictly as per Government rules.
- A student is eligible for free admission in only one institution.
- Free admission to Under Graduate Programmes (Arts and Science), neither ensures a particular subject combination as desired by the neither student nor Honours in a particular subject.
- College authority reserves the right for free admission and decision of the authority will be final.

NB: *There is no provision for free admission in **B.Com, BCA, BSc Biotechnology and all the Post Graduate Programmes** as these are self-financing.*

CANDIDATES SEEKING FREE ADMISSION SHALL HAVE TO PRODUCE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS IN ORIGINAL AT THE TIME OF VERIFICATION

- Mark sheet of the last qualifying examination
- Age Certificate/HSLC Admit Card
- Four copies of recent passport size photograph with white background
- Character Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended
- Caste Certificate wherever necessary (issued by the competent authority under the Government of Assam only shall be valid)
- PWD Certificate wherever necessary (issued by competent authority)
- Migration Certificate (for students migrating from a Board/ Council/ University other than ASSEB/G.U.) with a photocopy of the same.
- Gap Certificate (for candidates who have passed their qualifying examination earlier than the current year). Gap certificate must be issued by a Gazetted Officer.
- An undertaking from the applicant and his/her parent/guardian in the prescribed ANTI-RAGGING form.
- All downloaded mark sheets will have to be attested by the Head of the Institution last attended.

Reservation Rules

- There is a provision for reservation of seats, as per Government of Assam rules for the candidates belonging to the State of Assam. In this respect, caste certificate issued by the competent authority under Government of Assam only shall be valid.

Any change in the admission procedure will be notified in the college website.

Orientation Programme

IMPORTANT INFORMATIONS TO THE STUDENTS

IDENTITY CARD AND ACADEMIC CALENDAR

- An identity card will be issued to every student after admission to the College. The card shall contain information of the holder along with a recent passport size photograph of the student duly endorsed by the Principal.
- The Identity Card is non-transferable. A student must keep the Identity Card with him/her and he/she must produce the same whenever asked for.
- ***Students must renew his/her Identity Card at the end of each academic year positively.***
- Every student will be issued the **Academic Calendar** and the same has to be properly maintained by him/her. The records available in the Academic Calendar will be used for various official purposes concerning the student.

LIBRARY MEMBERSHIP

Library membership is compulsory for all students and library membership form will have to be submitted to the librarian after admission.

EXAMINATIONS

The College Examinations are held according to the College Academic Calendar for both Higher Secondary and Degree classes. A student must appear in all the examinations conducted by the College during an academic year. The College follows the rules and regulations of Gauhati University in the Under Graduate and Post Graduate Programmes. As such, a student's performance is strictly monitored through continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Internal assessment is based on Sessional Examinations, class tests, home assignments, seminars, projects, group discussions, field trips, class attendance etc. At the end of each semester a final external examination is conducted as per the schedule fixed by the University. The final result of a student will be based on the total marks obtained in both internal and external examinations. Students must secure pass marks in both internal and external examinations separately.

ATTENDANCE

All the students must attend their classes regularly. Students who do not attend at least 75% of the classes in each subject will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.

20% of the marks allotted for internal assessment (IA) will be awarded to the students based on class Attendance as per the guidelines of Gauhati University.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

Pandu College expects its students to be familiar with and adhere to this Code and any amendments brought to this Code

- Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes, tutorials, class tests examinations etc. Failure to obtain the required attendance percentage, non-submission of assignments and unjustified absence from tests /examinations will be treated as breaching the code of conduct.
- Student must be seated in their classrooms at the beginning of each period. They must not enter or leave the class room without permission of the lecturer.
- Impersonation during roll call is a punishable offence.
- When a lecturer is absent or is unable to take class, students should maintain a strict order among themselves so as to not disturb the adjoining classes
- Students must wear neat and clean and proper uniform. They must wear (display) the Identity Cards as long as they are on the college campus
- Resorting to any kind of malpractice (copying, impersonation, use of unfair means, exchanging answer-sheets) during examinations will not be tolerated and will be dealt with severely.
- Students should go through the College Notice Board regularly for all information (both online and offline). No excuse will be considered if notices are ignored.
- Students are expected to treat the members of the staff both teaching and non teaching and their fellow students with courtesy both in and outside the College. Students shall not, by their act or conduct, cause damage to the reputation of the institution.
- Students are not allowed to loiter or stand about the verandas or corridors of the College during class hours.
- Possession and consumption of tobacco, alcohol and use of intoxicants of any kind is strictly prohibited in the college campus and hostels. Pandu College is a **"Tobacco Free Zone"**.
- Students are forbidden from inviting friends from other institutions and outsiders to the College.
- Students must refrain from mishandling and tampering with library books, computer systems and other college properties.
- Students must participate in all academic and extra-curricular activities like Seminar, Workshop, College Week, sports, cultural, debate, quiz competitions and all National and Regional Festivals and use these as a platform to present themselves.
- It is essential on the part of all to respect the College Anthem.
- Cleanliness is a collective responsibility of each and every member of Pandu College. Spitting inside the college campus, writing slogans or sticking of bills on the walls is strictly prohibited.
- A student shall not commit or cause breach of peace inside and around the College campus.
- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the college and hostel campus. Students found indulging in act of ragging shall be strongly dealt with as per the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India to prevent and prohibit ragging in all Indian Educational Institutions and Colleges.
- Every student must abide by the rules and regulations of the college and the hostels.
- A student found guilty of misconduct or violating college rules shall be subject to disciplinary action. Disciplinary action includes expulsion from college, suspension for a period, debarring from appearing in examination, compulsory transfer etc.

All powers of maintenance of discipline and observance of college rules and regulations rest with the Principal of the College and his decision shall be final in all such matters.

ANTI-RAGGING POLICY

In conformity with Supreme Court of India judgements and directions, UGC guidelines and State Government Instructions, Pandu College is following ‘Zero-Tolerance Policy’ towards ragging. Any student of Pandu College accused and found guilty of ragging, will be severely dealt with, in accordance with the Provisions of the Law.

Ragging has ruined countless innocent lives and careers. It is now defined as an act that violates or is perceived to violate an individual student’s dignity. Ragging is totally banned in the campus and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or helping ragging is liable to be punished as it is criminal offence. Pandu College ensures strict compliance on the prevention of Ragging in the form.

Objectives

- To prohibit any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- To bring out an awareness among the students about the consequences of ragging.
- To keep a constant eye and vigilance over ragging so as to prevent its occurrence.
- To address any ragging issues immediately and taken action as advised by the committee.
- Anti-Ragging Cell executive meeting will be held at thrice in a year.

Anti-Ragging Policy

According to the UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Institutions, 2009, ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

- Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

Punishments

According to the UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, those found guilty may be awarded one or more of the following punishments, namely;

- Warning , writing apology letter
- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Powers and Functions: Anti Ragging

- To uphold and comply with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and be vigilant on any acts amounting to ragging;
- To publicize to all students and prevalent directives and the actions that can be taken against those indulging in ragging;
- To consider the complaints received from the students and conduct enquiry and submit report to the Anti- Ragging Committee along with punishment recommended for the offenders;
- Oversee the procedure of obtaining undertaking from the students in accordance with the provisions;
- Conduct workshops against ragging menace and orient the students;
- To provide students the information pertaining to contact address and telephone numbers of the person(s) identified to receive complaints/distress calls;
- To offer services of counseling and create awareness to the students;
- To take all necessary measures for prevention of Ragging inside the Campus.

GENDER POLICY OF PANDU COLLEGE

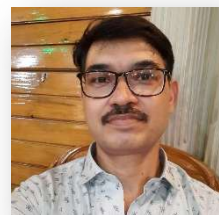
6. Department of Chemistry

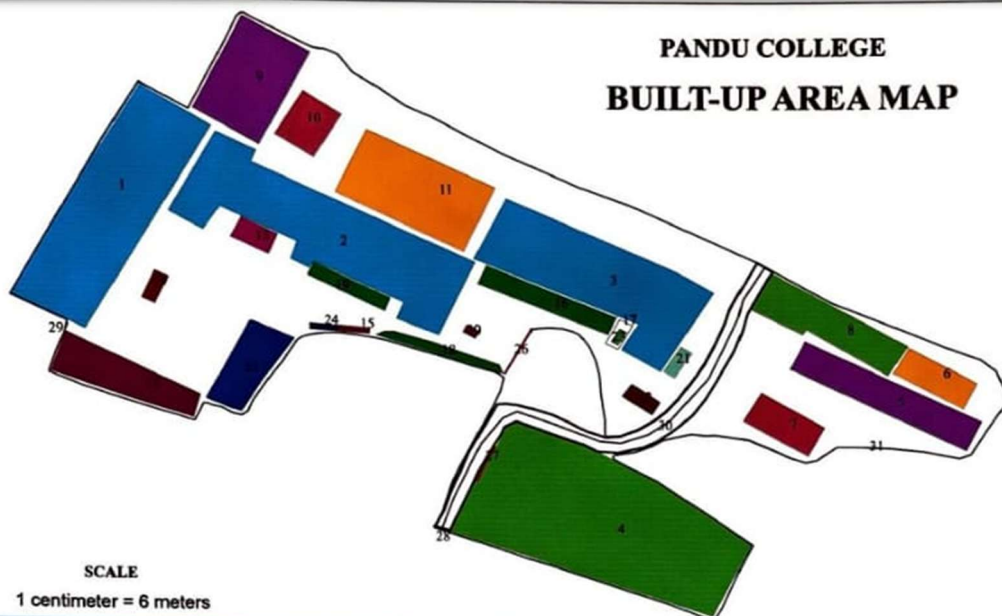
